Chester Harris, who was rector of St. Paul's for sixteen years during the 50's, 60's and early 70's, proposed, even before liturgical renewal, to do what now has taken place. For some reason the plan didn't fly with the leadership. A wooden cross was also to be suspended above the altar. I am mentioning this because while this has now taken place, there was the same idea years ago with my dad. So glad this has happened as the old altar area was very crowded, even when the altar wasn't moved out. St. Paul's continues to have a fond place in my heart, as those years in Montrose were good times. We moved to Montrose from Wilkes-Barre when I entered the tenth grade. A few years ago we were in Montrose, and when I celebrated my 50th high school reunion I celebrated and preach at St. Paul's. This was a time when you were between priests Back then we lived in the rectory at 72 Church Street. The side porch provided a great place to watch the parades. Sometime during my dad's tenure he also became the Mayor of Montrose. Anyway, just a few notes of history.
