Christmas 1937

Betty Smith at the Historical Society graciously made a copy of a picture taken at St. Paul's around Christmas 1937. There were garlands stretched to a light at the top of the arch over the altar steps which is no longer there. There was also a large heating grate from the coal furnace in the middle of the aisle that is now covered by the rug. The railing up the altar stairs had not been added yet. The music board above the organ shows that the photo was the 4th Sunday off Advent and there were white pines in front of the first pew.
