Meeting was called to order at 5:44 p.m.

Senior Warden, Lynne Graham welcomed everyone.

Opening Prayer: Senior Warden Lynne Graham.

Approval of Agenda:

Jane Chandler made the motion to approve the Agenda Lynne Graham seconded. Motion carried.

Approval of July Minutes:

Maggie Sock noted on page two of the July minutes the sentence reading; *The state also needs lights; should read; The stage also needs lights.* Martha Kupscznk made the motion to approve the minutes with the correction; Vickie Calby seconded. Motion carried.

Bible Study:

This evening we reflected on Acts: 10: 44-48.

Questions for Bishop Sean:

Lynne told the Vestry that she had written the Bishop for clarification on two matters; the first being we have five of seven Vestry members whose terms will be up at the end of the year. Because we are in the process of looking for a new Priest and this falls mainly on the Vestry's shoulders there is concern about continuity. Lynne wondered if due to the size of our congregation and lack of those willing to serve on Vestry, if there was a special consideration that could be made in order that the term of those leaving could be extended if individuals are willing. Secondly, she wondered about filling the Junior Warden position and who is eligible. The Bishop's reply was he would need to study the Canons and get back to Lynne. He also said at the minimum we would have to set-up staggered terms.

Change of Vestry Meeting Day:

At July's Vestry meeting we were informed that Sandy Seeger would not be able to attend meetings any longer due to a new job commitment on Wednesday evenings. Previously, the Vestry had changed our meeting night to Wednesday's when Sandy Darde's job commitments changed. Lynne spoke with Sandy Darde and found that her schedule had also changed making Sandy Darde available on Tuesday evenings. We will change our meetings back to Tuesdays at 5:30.

Property Report:

The Vestry reviewed Dan Graham's Property Report.

Some of the highlights:

- More lighting will be added to certain spots inside due to increased use of our property at night;
- A Redbud tree will be planted in the Memorial Garden in Karen Holgate's memory;
- A mop sink was added to the rear of the kitchen. Shelves will be added;
- Kitchen renovation has been started;
- A broken board was replaced on the stage

New Business:

- Vestry discussed the possibility of helping with the UMC Wednesday night dinners. No resolution was reached.
- Inviting District Attorney Bob Klein to speak was discussed. No resolution.
- Discussion regarding sponsorship to donate bread each month for the MMFP, the cost would be approximately \$250.00. Those present agreed we would like to do this but should take an e-mail vote from those not present. If all agree we will take a second collection each Sunday to cover the cost.

Old Business:

We still have \$1700.00 in profit from the Country Store that we have not distributed. There was discussion on where this money should be donated. Jane Chandler made the motion that the funds be distributed as follows: \$1,000.00 Interfaith \$250.00 Food Bank

\$ 450.00 Women's Resource Center Martha seconded the motion.Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report:

Lynne Graham stopped at Ventresca's Tax Service hoping to get a price quote from Joe Lubash for doing St. Paul's audit from 2009 to present. Joe gave Lynne a quote of \$1,120.00 along with his apologizes for not getting back to Dave with this sooner.

We also have a quote from Vicki Strock CIA, CFE, for an amount not to exceed \$9,950.00. Dave Calby recommended we accept Vicki Strock's bid based on the fact that Vicki is a CIA and CFE. She stated in her bid that she will follow the guidelines of the Episcopal Church Business Manual.

Jane Chandler made the motion that we accept Vicki Strock's bid based on Dave Calby's recommendation.

Martha Kupscznk seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Coats for the Community to Start Distributing Coats in October

For over ten years, the American Legion Gardner-Warner Post 154 has been involved in the Coats for the Community Program. This is a low-key, local program run by local volunteers directly benefits our community. The program distributes coats from October to December at seven locations throughout Susquehanna County. The sites include four churches, Blue Ridge High School, St John Neumann Center and Gardner-Warner Post 154. St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Montrose also keeps a number of coats for urgent situations as needed for a year round distribution.

The program gave out more than 1600 warm coats last year, the majority of which went to children. Coats are obtained by coat drives at a number of sites; donations from the Burlington Coat Factory and the Montrose Interfaith; and financial donations from the Legion, local businesses, St. Paul's and individuals. Donations allowed the purchase of over 625 children's coats at Salvation Army's on half-price Wednesdays this year. The cost per coat averaged under \$4.00.

Donations of nearly new or gently used winter coats that you no longer need are accepted and appreciated anytime. Sites to donate include St. Paul's, the Legion and Pro-Care Physical Therapy. Cash donations likewise are needed and are always welcomed. Your \$20.00 gift buys five children's coats. Questions can be directed to John Finlon at the American Legion.
