In the 19th and 20th centuries, women were a prime source of missionary support and funding of the church.. Celebrating its 125th anniversary several years ago, the UTO has supported many missions in the US and throughout the world. The UTO became known for collecting the prayers and grateful offerings of the women in thanksgiving for the many blessings of life. Blue mite boxes, known as "The Blue Box" that collected the offerings would eventually achieve the status as the symbol of the UTO. There have been changes to the UTO over the years, but the ministry of the United Thank Offering has remained the same since its founding... .recognize your blessings, make a thank offering into your Blue Box (or Blue envelope) and it will go to support mission and ministry around the world. The Blue Box is a wonderful idea. Place it where you will see it, on your dresser, on your kitchen counter, in your car or where-ever you may drop a coin to say "thank you God for...." 

The main waterline comes into church from the alley out back, through our parking lot and into the Organ Pump Room off Room 1 in the basement. Just turn off the valve and let Dan or John know.
