
## **Pancake Supper on Tuesday**

## Photograph of St. Paul's First Rector Obtained

St. Paul's first rector was Rev. Samuel Marks. He served at St. Paul's parish from 1831 to 1834. He was born in County Armagh, Northern Ireland in 1797. He was a missionary for the Society of the Protestant Episcopal Church for the Advancement of Christianity in Pennsylvania and was paid \$150 a year. After leaving St. Paul', he founded Christ Church in Huron, Ohio and died there in 1882. Rev. Mike Floyd, the current rector, sent us his photograph. It was taken in the late 1860's.
