# **Communion Table**

When our current church was built in 1856, it did not have an altar; it had a communion table. Rev. Ralph Armfield Weatherly was called to be St. Paul's rector in 1921. Under his rector ship, in 1923, the church purchased the current oak altar and added the communion rail at the same time. The oak communion table was probably brought from the first church (1833) but was definitely at our current church by 1857. The tables' whereabouts and usage during the last 95 years after it was removed from the chancel are at this time uncertain but it is currently located on the stage. Take a look at it sometime when you are in the Parish Hall and you will get to see some real St. Paul's history.
