ST. PAUL'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH STUDIES FOR ADVENT 2018

A few members of St. Paul's have spoken with me concerning a form of study during the Advent 2018 season. I'm more than amenable (excited, actually) about such an offering. I envision offering studies on the first three Sundays in Advent (Dec. 2nd, 9th, and 16th. Since the fourth Sunday is the day before Christmas Eve (the Eve of the Eve???), I've not scheduled a study session for that date.

My plan is to meet in the Guild Room during the Sunday coffee hour. I plan on beginning about 11:30 and ending by not later than 12:30.

It is my intention to offer the following:

Sunday, Dec. 2nd – Prophecies of the coming of the Messiah

Sunday, Dec. 9th – The birth in Bethlehem of Judea

Sunday, Dec. 16th – Conclusion of the birth in Bethlehem of Judea.

Now, please, if your plans permit you to attend only one or two sessions, then, by all means, do so. If your plans require you to depart by noon, go in peace! Neither your dropping in and out, nor you early departure, will be seen as rude.

Please know that I see Advent as a smaller, slightly less somber, penitential season for preparing for the anniversary of the Birth of the Christ Child, not unlike Lent is to the Feast of the Resurrection.

TREK TO THE CRECHE, 2018

This is a program to help folks get out and about and enjoy just a bit of easy exercise this December. It is loosely based upon a program initially developed by Episcopal Health Ministries. As with all such programs, please speak with your physician prior to beginning any exercise regimen.

That which we'll be attempting to accomplish is walking the equivalent distance that Mary and Joseph travelled from Nazareth of Galilee to Bethlehem of Judea. Scholars deduce that they made this trip in about four days. Keep in mind, however, that the primary means of travel in that society was walking, so not even an advanced pregnancy would have slowed them too much. We will be taking 23 days (1st Sunday in Advent through Christmas Eve) to complete our trek and, since none of us is likely to be avid walkers like Mary and Joseph, we'll be working in teams of 2 or 3. Working in small teams will not only permit us to ease into a walking routine, but will also provide the opportunity for some meaningful conversation while we're "on the road". The distance to be walked is roughly eighty (80) miles. For teams of 2, that would require an average of 1.75 miles per day per member while, for teams of 3, 1.16 miles per day per team would be needed.

Please appoint one member of your team as "captain" to record and give the weekly team mileage to me. You can certainly give me that mileage each Sunday during Advent, or you can e-mail it to me on Sundays (<u>frjohn@ptd.net</u>).

The climatological data for Montrose show that the average high for December is 35°, while the average low is 17°. Average snowfall for the month is 15". In consideration of that historical data, as well as to protect your health, please make sure that you speak with your physician prior to undertaking any exercise regimen.

I mentioned earlier about "easing into" a walking routine. Here's what's on the horizon...

During Lent of 2019, in teams, we'll be walking the equivalent distance from Montrose, PA to Jerusalem, Israel, in time to arrive for the Resurrection. That likely seems like an insurmountable task but, having worked with this program at previous parishes, it is most definitely doable! Not only that, the weather in spring is far more conducive to being outside... (and, for spring, we'll permit rowing, weightlifting, Zumba Dancing, or other forms of exercise)

So, pick your teams, select your captains, and do let me know if you have any questions. Please also know that Lynne will be contacting other Montrose Churches and inviting them to join us this Advent as well as next Lent. So, you might just have an opportunity to greet others of God's Kids out and about!! Fr. John
