Centering Prayer is Alive and Well

Be still and know that I am God. Psalm 46:10 In the fall we made the conscious decision to re-think our practice of holding Centering Prayer in the sanctuary at noon on Wednesdays. Now, in the penitential season of Lent, we hope to encourage folks to join us in prayer at noon on Wednesdays in their homes or places of work. We will come together in the church for prayer at noon on the Wednesday of Holy Week and thereafter on the last Wednesday of the month. The following are four quidelines to Centering

The following are four guidelines to Centering Prayer:

1. Choose a sacred word as the symbol of your intention to consent to God's presence and action within.

2. Sitting comfortably with eyes close, settle briefly and silently introduce the sacred word as the symbol of your consent to God's presence and action within.

3. When engaged with your thoughts (including body sensations, feelings, images, and reflections) return ever so gently to the sacred word.

4. At the end of the prayer period (20 minutes is suggested), remain in silence with eyes closed for a couple of minutes.

During your prayer time, think of each "thought interruption" as an opportunity to return to God. On Ash Wednesday, we are invited to the observance of a Holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and selfdenial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word. Centering Prayer offers quiet time to sit with God.


