Sustaining Prayer

As I am sure most of you know, the three churches (Christ Church, Susquehanna; St. Mark's, New Milford; and St. Paul's) submitted a Profile to the Office of Transition Ministry for the Diocese in March. We offered a full time clergy position as Priest-in-Charge to be shared among the three parishes. We named our 3-church group the Susquehanna County Episcopal Ministries and the "search committee" consisted of the three Sr. Wardens and Vickie Calby, our Jr. Warden.

In mid-July, Bishop Kevin presented two candidates for our consideration. We contacted them right away and arranged for Skype interviews as soon as our search committee had all returned from consecutive vacations. One candidate withdrew right before the interview as she had been called to a parish.

We are in the process of interviewing the remaining candidate and are very positive about his qualifications and skills. We have checked references and heard good things. Arrangements have been made to fly the candidate to visit with us in person. He will interview with Bishop Kevin and meet with the combined Vestries.

You will have an opportunity to meet with the candidate during his visit at an Evening Prayer service and homily led by him on Friday, September 27 at 6:00 pm at St. Mark's. All are welcome. This is not a time to pepper him with questions, but to meet and greet in our usual hospitable fashion. The Vestries will meet with him the following morning.

I need to stress that, at this point, no formal call has been made to the candidate. We are still in the interviewing process, but wanted to offer parishioners an opportunity to meet our candidate.

During our announcements before the service, more information will be forthcoming as we receive it. This is also a reminder that we need sustaining prayer for our candidate, Fr. Arthur, and for our search process. Pray, Pray, Pray.
