## **Vestry Highlights February 13, 2020**

- We welcomed John Warriner as our new Vestry member.
- We elected Vickie Calby as Junior Warden, John Finlon as Treasurer, and Karen Blye-McAbee as Clerk of the Vestry. Fr. Arthur appointed Lynne Graham as Senior Warden with her consent.
- We read Romans 12:9-21 where it was laid out very specifically how we should treat our neighbors as ourselves in love and how we should repay evil with good.

- Dan Graham visited Christ Church and was impressed with the improvements made on the building. He requested that we offer \$250 to them to buy supplies and materials such as paint to continue their work. The Vestry unanimously agreed.
- Fr. Arthur reported that he has engaged a company in California to start work on a logo for St. Paul's and thereafter one for Christ Church, one for St. Mark's, and one for the Episcopal Parishes of Upper Susquehanna County. He reads the daily offices and has been livestreaming them on Facebook. The livestreaming of the services has been well attended by people from numerous states.
- On Ash Wednesday we will offer "driveby" ashes and a bag lunch. The Ash Wednesday service will be held at St. Mark's at 10:00 a.m..
