Easter Treat & Bread Donations

For many years while growing up, our parents took us to Ontario, Canada for summer vacation. We stayed on an island in a rustic cabin and therefore entertained ourselves in the evening by playing games. My father always brought along a drawstring leather bag full of pennies. This was our poker money. Although I am quite sure we children did not measure up to Dad's skill level, nonetheless, we had a great time learning the rules of the game. Before each new round, Dad would say, "OK, ante up." The pennies that we threw into the pot bought us a seat at the table for the next game.

As part of our Lenten discipline this year, we were asked to keep track of items that we chose to forego as a means of abstinence or fasting. The total cost of these un-purchased items could be donated towards the Easter treats for the recipients of Meals on Wheels. In this case, the "ante up" is retroactive to the beginning of Lent, but is no less meaningful at the end Lent. Our donations offered in observance of Lent, bought us the satisfaction of having served a marginalized group of our neighbors that we could not serve one on one.

THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

The Gospel - Touch me and see

Jesus himself stood among the disciples and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. Touch me and see; for a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While in their joy they were disbelieving and still wondering, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of broiled fish, and he took it and ate in their presence.

Then he said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you—that everything written about me in the law of Moses, the prophets, and the psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Messiah is to suffer and to rise from the dead on the third day, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins is to be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem.
