

OPENING SENTENCE

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

CONFESSION OF SIN

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor. *Silence may be kept.*

Almighty God, Source of all that is, Giver of every good gift:

You create all people in your image and call us to love one another as you love us. We confess that we have failed to honor you in the great diversity of the human family. We have desired to live in freedom, while building walls between ourselves and others. THE LESSONS

THE FIRST READING - Acts 10:44-48

While Peter was still speaking, the Holy Spirit fell upon all who heard the word. The circumcised believers who had come with Peter were astounded that the gift of the Holy Spirit had been poured out even on the Gentiles, for they heard them speaking in tongues and extolling God. Then Peter said, "Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" So he ordered them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they invited him to stay for several days.

THE THIRD SONG OF ISAIAH Isaiah 60:1-3, 11a, 14c, 18-19 Arise, shine, for your light has come,* and the glory of the Lord has dawned upon you. For behold, darkness covers the land;* deep gloom enshrouds the peoples. But over you the Lord will rise,* and his glory will appear upon you. Nations will stream to your light,* and kings to the brightness of your dawning. Your gates will always be open;* by day or night they will never be shut. They will call you, The City of the Lord,* The Zion of the Holy One of Israel. Violence will no more be heard in your land,* ruin or destruction within your borders. You will call your walls, Salvation,* and all your portals, Praise. The sun will no more be your light by day;* by night you will not need the brightness of the moon. THE GOSPEL - John 15:9-17

Jesus said to his disciples, "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete.

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name.
