# View from the Pulpit: Mo. Liz

As we enter the third week of Eastertide, we continue to encounter the risen Christ with the disciples. And as we enter the second half of April, we look forward to welcoming our snowbird migration back to the north. Along with the disciples, we are offered the opportunity to greet one another anew in ministry saying, "Peace be with you" to everyone we interact with. We are also given the opportunity to approach our ministries refreshed and renewed by our encounter with the risen Christ. Yesterday I attended the Convocation I meeting with Bishop Kevin at Christ Church in Towanda along with some of our parishioners. The focus of the meeting was to hear about the ongoing process towards possible reunification with the Diocese of Central PA. Below is a simple breakdown of the process. DISCOVER, LISTEN, INFORM, DISCERN Phase I. Exploration (Gather Data & Input) Phase II: Collate and Analyze Data//Listening Sessions Phase III: Consider Models for Reunification Phase IV: Propose a Reunification Model & Timeline Phase V: Prepare Resolutions for a Joint Convention in 2024

Currently the committee is in phase three, having gathered data and input; analyzed it and shared their findings at last year's conventions. The committee is leaning towards one model however they are still considering several. There are also at least three options being considered by the bishops as to how they will handle the process if indeed we vote to reunify. Also, Bishop Audrey has developed three models for visitation scheduling for the bishop of the new diocese.

In addition, the committee will be reaching out to members of both dioceses to get their input regarding materials requiring more information regarding various areas being considered such as design of the proposed diocese, finances, property, canons and constitutions, ministries, and staffing.

All in all it was a very informative meeting and we left feeling assured that the possible reunification is being considered from a position of the strength of the two dioceses as well as the strengths of each of them. Additionally, the committee is being very diligent and thorough in their processes and are to be acknowledged for all of their hard work.

There is a website dedicated to the reunification process. It is reunificationdiobethdiocpa.org. If you have any questions, please let me know, I'll answer what I can and try to find out the answer if I do not know it.

## The First Step is Showing Up

Did you ever stop to consider what a blessing it is that we can go to almost any city in this country, find an Episcopal church, walk in, and feel comfortable with the liturgy? This access to a home away from home begins with belonging to a parish that is part of a Diocese which is part of the Episcopal Church (nationwide and in other countries) which is part of the Anglican Communion. Like nesting eggs, each part belongs inside a larger entity, and all are supportive of one another from the bottom up and the top down.

No parish can exist by itself. As our denominational population decreases and our number of parishes shrinks, we will need to be more fully present with those parishes that nestle with us in the larger "egg." We need to make connections with one another, learn from each other, and become the body of Christ together.

And, just in case you were worried about how one might do that, here is an excellent opportunity. For the modest cost of \$25 (scholarships available), you may participate in a planned day of fellowship, formation, and food at Gather 24 on May 4 at PNC Field near Scranton. The day includes an address from our Bishop, diocesan worship, free lunch, and 21 sessions to choose from to fill your day. There is also a panel discussion with Bishop Kevin and Bishop Audrey Scanlan (Diocese of Central PA) about Reunification Discernment. ## This week's Gospel according to: Luke


#### Meeting of Convocation 1


#### A 2nd Round of Diaper Delivery
