Like the lady, who's a friend of a friend, that offered me (and Brindi and Shadow) her house to stay in that is 6 miles from the hospital in Bethlehem. Or the lady at the self-checkout at Weis. After seeing the stressed foggy headed look on my face (Harry has done shopping for 25 years), emptied the cart, rang everything up and then gave me a big hug. When I started to cry she hugged me more. And the girlfriend of one of my contractors who, after meeting for the first time, offered to have me stay at her home when Harry goes to the rehab facility. All Angels among us. We feel so thankful and blessed.
