View from the Pulpit: Father Bill

"Trust God's truth."

The 6th Sunday of the Epiphany, begins with a reading from the prophet Jeremiah. Here the prophet uses Israel's Wilderness experience to teach about God's providence. For Israel knew too well, that survival depended on finding those fertile places, where life could flourish, and water was plentiful. Just so, are those who trust in God, and sink their roots in his law and love. Only God, the Lord, can be trusted with the human heart, for God never betrays those who trust in him.

This makes us pause to ask: "Who do we trust with our heart? Who has never, and will never, betray our trust? —Such a person is of more value than a treasure found in a field, or a pearl of great price. Can you on reflection, state that you have ever found a friend like that? ---In all your life, all your troubles, have you ever thought to place all your trust in the God of love, who created you? Why? Why not? Maybe, because God is our Father, and we, his children."

In the 2nd Reading, from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, he touches on the central theme of his theology. 'Everything depends on Christ having risen from the dead.' Resurrection is central for Paul, because he has seen the risen Christ, and experienced that flood of the 'Spirit' that changed his life. Without resurrection there would be no Christ to proclaim. With Resurrection our salvation, our rising, is assured. We, 'ecclesia' are the result of Christ's life, death, and Resurrection. In the Gospel from Luke 6:17f Jesus comes down the mountain and teaches the crowd on the barren plain. Power has left him from all who have touched him for healing. Now he utters the words that we know as the 'Beatitudes'. They are sacred. They are the unfolding of the great commandment the 'hesed 'of God that mandates we 'love our neighbor'. "Blessed are the poor for theirs is the Kingdom of God!" More than that, the Gospel and the words of Jesus, condemn the rich, the powerful, the merciless, the greedy, and the purveyors of misery, on all who suffer. It is a judgment in the tradition of the prophets, with their 'Woe Oracles!' "But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are full, you will be hungry; woe to you who laugh, you will mourn. Woe to you who receive praise, for you have heard false prophets."

Somewhere in the Beatitudes, there is the essence of the word: 'Truth'. Not a popular word when today politicians state: "Truth is what I say it is!" No, my friend! Long before you were weaned, God stamped his truth on the human soul and heart. Live by God's truth and you will be loved by God, and you in humility, will love God and his truth. Amen.

This week's Gospel according to: Luke

Jesus said, "I say to you that listen, Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who abuse you. If anyone strikes you on the cheek, offer the other also; and from anyone who takes away your coat do not withhold even your shirt. Give to everyone who begs from you; and if anyone takes away your goods, do not ask for them again. Do to others as you would have them do to you. "If you love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners love those who love them. If you do good to those who do good to you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same. If you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what credit is that to you? Even sinners lend to sinners, to receive as much again. But love your enemies, do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return. Your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High; for he is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked. Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful.

"Do not judge, and you will not be judged; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven; give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap; for the measure you give will be the measure you get back."
