View from the Pulpit: Father Bill

The Journey of the Donkey.

Palm Sunday.----The very name 'Palm Sunday,' should fill all of us with excitement. It is the very first day of Holy Week, or Passion Week, to give it its full title. Let me tell you in one word what this week is all about: It is all about 'love'.

"God so loved the world that he sent his only beloved Son that he might die for us and win for us eternal life."

There, that is Holy Week in its entirety. How interesting that Jesus begins this week by entering Jerusalem the Holy City, riding on a donkey. For it seems to me, that once before he came to Jerusalem and was presented in the Temple, riding on a donkey. It was on a donkey that he fled into Egypt, reversing the whole saga of Hebrew Salvation, for it was Moses and the people who came up out of Egypt at the Exodus.

"Out of Egypt have I called my Son," we read in holy scripture. Another picture comes to mind, in reading today's Gospel, of Jesus the Christ entering Jerusalem. It is the image of King David entering Jerusalem have brought the Ark of the Covenant from Shechem. Then David danced before the Ark, and the people came out to cheer and wave their palms. Now they come again, to wave palms for this new king, Jesus of Nazareth.

In the very first reading from Isaiah 50, the prophet speaks in the first person. It is from the 'Suffering Servant' passage of the Book of Isaiah, in which the figure who suffers is clearly the Messiah, Jesus Christ.

This continues in the Second Reading, of Paul writing to the Philippians in Chapter 2. Here he speaks of Jesus' humility in accepting the will of his Father. In his great act of salvation and redemption he has earned our love and admiration.

There is an invitation extended on this holy day of Palm Sunday: it is to walk this Passion Week with Christ. To walk through his Last Supper, His Suffering in the Garden, His trials; Calvary itself and to stand by his Cross.

Only then can we see this Act of Love in its entirety and truly celebrate his glorious Resurrection come Easter Morning. Amen.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes.

But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, `I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

Play


