### View from the Pulpit: Father Bill

### Hear it: "He Has Risen!"

Easter Sunday. One of the miracles of Easter, that becomes immediately revealed in the Acts of the Apostles is the transformation of the Apostles from frightened men, in hiding, to witnesses and proclaimers of the Gospel.

We see this in the First Reading today, from Acts 10f. Peter tells the story of Jesus to the crowd. Now he is strong, sure and resolute. It is no longer the Peter who denied Jesus three times and ran to weep bitterly outside the walls.

This reading asks us all a question: "How many times have we denied Christ in our life?" We pity Peter and even sympathize with him, knowing how close he was to Jesus from the beginning. We rarely think of that Sunday morning when we decide to turn in bed and give church a skip! Or the times we could have spoken up at work when the loudmouth said: "Who believes all this junk? Isn't Jesus Christ just a pile of myths anyway?"

Our silence is Peter's denial. Our speaking up to say: "I believe," is our proclaiming the Gospel as Peter does today in Acts. –Paul in the Second Reading tells the Corinthians that Jesus' true victory is over death. Not just his own death on the cross, but our death, the death we inherited from Adam. For there is a new kingdom rising, a new day, and now it belongs to us who believe.

Of all the characters and figures in the New Testament most of us have a secret love for Mary Magdalene. She is the girl at the foot of the cross. The woman who places the dead body of Jesus into the arms of his grieving mother, Mary. Here today, she rises before first light and goes to the tomb to anoint the body of Jesus, according to Jewish custom. It is Mary who finds the tomb empty; Mary who is spoken to by the Angels; Mary who first meets the risen Christ.

Jesus' message to Mary, 'to go and tell the apostles 'is truly the first Gospel if we understand the word 'Gospel' to mean 'the Good News'. This is the Good News' of Easter Sunday, that Christ has risen from the dead, after three days and his kingdom has begun.

Ask yourself today: "Does the risen Christ live in your life? Are you a proclaimer or a denier? Has the Good News of Christ transformed your life? If church, religion, faith, was taken away by an act of government tomorrow, would it be a major change in your life?"

Decide today that like Mary and Peter, you will choose to be an evangelist, one who goes and tells the news of Jesus Christ to others and in any way you can. Amen.



### This week's Gospel according to: John

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
