View from the Pulpit:

The Rev. Susan Treanor

View from the pulpit, or the middle aisle.

Alleluia!, the construction project going on in my house since June 1 was finished yesterday. Some of the furniture went back and I have to find things like china and glasses but I am delighted with the work which demolished and rebuilt a 26' exterior wall which looks out on my pond and is mostly windows. This sun room acts as a place of reflection/relaxation and my breakfast eating area.

Secondly, I am announcing a new way for us to pray together. Starting Aug 5, Tuesday night I will be zooming the church's night prayer: Compline every Tuesday for the foreseeable future.. It is my favorite prayer in our office and is a great way to end the day. You will find it on p 127 to 135 in our Book of Common Prayer. Since I am doing this using Zoom, I will email all of you the invitation in a few days. I hope you all have at least one copy of the book in your homes. In addition to having the Eucharistic Prayers, it has all the psalms, all the hours of the office from morning prayer to compline and many other resources to help us to pray. If you don't have the book at home, there are gently used copies for you to take in the parish hall.

Thirdly, I want to get feedback from you on 2 things: My sermons from the middle aisle and Our communion practice.

This communion practice has evolved over the last few months. You have probably heard me preach on the importance of acknowledging (by how we do things) the abundance of God's presence, the fact that we are commanded in the Gospel's depiction of the last supper and our service of the Eucharist to eat and drink. Dunking a host in a chalice was born in our fear of infection during COVID. We are not continuing that practice. I have a recently published article which says the safe way to receive the wine is to drink out of the chalice. I can make anyone a copy who would like it.

I realize that the hosts we use for communion do not depict bread very faithfully and I've been told you used to make bread for communion. Does anyone remember that? Does anyone feel called to do that?

Lastly, I have been reading the annual reports since 2007. I have shared some of the information with members as they happen to be in the office. The general reaction is" we never did that". Our institutional memories are very short. In Christ,
