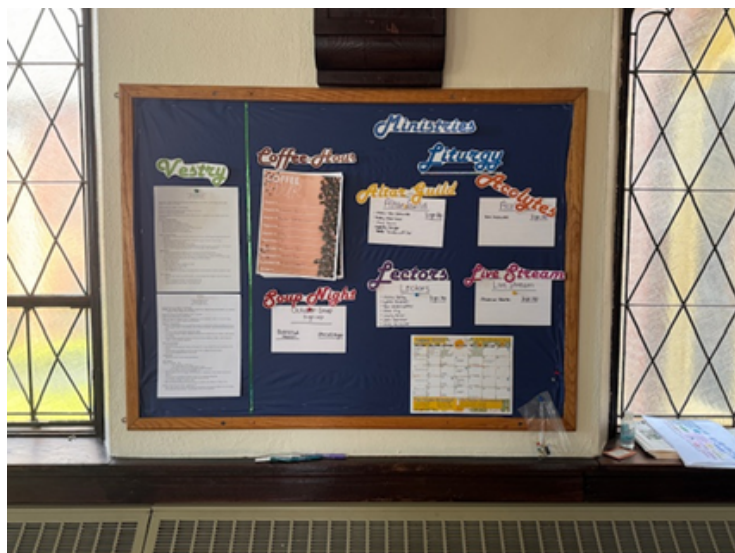
St. Paul's Defibrillator
