View from the middle aisle:

The office is particularly active and busy today.

We reconciled the discretionary account. In the last month we have helped three people with their security deposit. We canceled one check that had never been used toward repairs necessary to get a car passed inspection. Our balance is almost \$900. Currently we deposit the plate from the first week of the month plus we take an additional \$300.00 donation from the church.

John, Lynne, and I spent last Friday and Saturday at the last convention for the Diocese of Bethlehem. Our merger with the Diocese of Central PA into the Diocese of the Susquehanna is scheduled to be effective 12:01 a.m. on January 1 of 2026. Many of us have been working hard on the Bylaws, Canons, Constitutions, ministries, and budgets that will govern us at least initially. We elected Bishop Audrey Scanlon to be the first Bishop of this new diocese. She appointed Bishop Nichols as her assistant. They appear to be dividing the work of the new diocese into two categories: Pastoral for Bishop Audrey and administrative and financial for Bishop Kevin.

Beside the work of figuring out how we are going to function, for me, it was great being with the clergy and lay people whom I have come to know in the last 16 years. This merger will be a work in progress for at least 2026. There is hope that we can expand our ministries together. Keep this new association in your prayers.

- 1. The vote is in. We have tallied up the paper ballots that you filled out the last two weeks to choose our new mission statement. The vast majority of you have chosen "Embracing all in Christ through our love and service.". So this is how this congregation would like to define our church and I think that it is absolutely wonderful! Thank you all for your interest and dedication.
- 2. This past Friday and Saturday, Reverend Susan, Lynne Graham, and I attended the annual diocesan convention. There was quite a bit of business to take care of. Bishop Audrey Scanlan was officially elected as our bishop of the Diocese of the Susquehanna, which will go into effect January 1st, 2026 until her retirement around October 2027 when Bishop Kevin Nichols will resume duties as our bishop until 2030. Most of the ballot measures had to do with matters of the reunification of our two dioceses. One of the main purposes of this year's convention was to vote on formally approving an Agreement and Plan of Merger of the two existing dioceses, and to adopt the Constitution and the Canons, including Transitional Canons. One item that was approved effected us locally. Our annual meeting here was required to take place by 31 January each year. The hard deadline has been removed, which is good because you never know the weather at that time of year.

- 4. Endless Mountains Theater Company three productions this past weekend in our Parish Hall, providing good entertainment for our community.

I come with joy to meet my Lord Forgiven, Loved, And Free; In Awe And Wonder To Recall His Life Laid Down For Me.


