## Old photo of Church Street

Here's an early 1900s photograph of Church Street looking east towards St. Paul's from where the light is today. While you can't see St. Paul's because of the trees, but here's a great picture of the old Montrose House on Chestnut Street. The hotel was directly across from St. Paul's and it was the first thing our parishioners saw when leaving church. It was torn down in 1927 and replaced by the Montrose Inn, the structure that became the bank that is there now.
