# View from the Middle Aisle

Three thoughts this week:

1) I looked up a definition of a dirty word last Sunday: politics. I found: Politics is the set of activities that are associated with making decisions in groups, or other forms of power relations among individuals, such as the distribution of status or resources.

As I have been saying: our identity is not democratic or republican, left or right. We are more centrally followers of Jesus Christ and His teachings should inform our relations with each other, our politics and our ethics.

2) Our Lenten series starts on Ash Wednesday and will proceed on a weekly basis. However, the following sessions will happen Tuesday nights at 5:00. Sunset is currently at 5:30. I will therefore be changing my workdays at St Paul's – I'll come Tuesday for our discussion and stay til Thursday.

Currently these discussions are planned to be in person and since it is happening around meal time, and since the book we are using is "Meeting Jesus at the Table", we will share a simple meal.

## This week's Gospel according to: Matthew

Six days later, Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain, by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly there appeared to them Moses and Elijah, talking with him. Then Peter said to Jesus, "Lord, it is good for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three dwellings here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." While he was still speaking, suddenly a bright cloud overshadowed them, and from the cloud a voice said, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone. As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Tell no one about the vision until after the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

One of the items on the agenda will be the elections for two of our parishioners, Dave Robbins and Shelly Green, to be added to the vestry, who were nominated by committee and approved by the vestry in December's meeting.

- I'm taking a class on the history of the Episcopal Church. A lot of reading involved with this, but some very interesting facts to learn. In the 18th century is when we really started the use of hymns in church. We have had 6 hymnals, starting with the 1789 version, that went along with the Book of Common Prayer and only 27 hymns, and ending in our 1982 hymnal. I'm very glad that they did start using music, even though in the beginning it was mainly the psalms they sang which were unaccompanied by any instruments and the hymnal was just in text.
